Marino Institute of Education is offering a special **mathematics summer school for boys and girls in third class going into fourth class in September 2013.**

The class will be taught by Seán Delaney, an experienced primary school teacher and lecturer in mathematics education in Marino.

During the five-day mathematics enrichment course, students will have opportunities to explore and develop a deeper understanding of important mathematical ideas. Emphasis will be placed on problem solving and other skills of the primary school curriculum.

- Open to all children entering fourth class in September
- Suitable for children of **all** mathematical backgrounds and experiences
- Free for children
- Lunch will be provided each day
- 10 minutes homework each day
- Places limited to 5 children from any one school and 20 children in total
- Children must be able to attend every day
- Physical education option with Suzy Mackin for participating children (from 1 to 2 pm daily)

Parents/guardians of students who get a place in the summer school will be invited to a meeting in Marino at 8pm on Wednesday, June 26th, where they will receive further information about the summer school.

Important Note: There is no charge for pupils to attend this summer school. However, primary teachers and some other education professionals will be observing the class in order to learn more about teaching mathematics. Additionally, video and audio recordings of the lessons will be made and copies of the students' work will be collected; these will be viewed and discussed by the observers and other educational researchers. Detailed information about the activities will be provided to parents/guardians of interested pupils.
