Tips on Starting a Virtual Book Club

The pleasure of reading is multiplied when we share our ideas, explore differences of opinion, and find common interests. And though the online iteration of a book club may take place in possibly unventured territory for some, the same basic structures still apply!

Ultimately, the goals of a Virtual Book Club are to have a shared reading experience, have fun, and connect with others.

Here are some simple and effective Virtual Book Club tips and tricks!

1. An eBook will need to be decided upon. This can be done during an initial “meet ‘n’ greet,” a short, casual get-together where everyone gets to know the other Virtual Book Club members by sharing a little about themselves—what class they are in, what they enjoy reading, their hobbies, and so on.
2. Once an eBook is decided upon, it’s time to get reading. This can be done solo or as a group (for details, read on!).
3. One of the fun advantages of a Virtual Book Club is that members can meet online to read chapters together. It’s an awesome way to make reading pleasurable, and the club gets to enjoy great moments in the story collectively. Together, they can laugh out loud, feel suspense, express surprise, and ask questions if there’s any confusion! And they can even take turns being the voice of different characters!
4. Make it a team effort where everyone feels accommodated! If the eBook is long, set a chapter or page limit before the next meet—this way, no member feels under pressure to read more than they are able or have time for. Also, this prevents faster and more confident readers from moving too far ahead in the book and accidentally giving spoilers!
5. The length of the eBook will determine the number of club meets, and the members’ time availability can help determine the length of the chosen eBook. Typically, most children may only have time for one meeting per week. If the eBook is short, a new title can be selected at the end of the meeting for the next club meet. Just use your judgement to decide and plan accordingly!
6. A friendly and respectful atmosphere should be established as the basis of the meet. Discussion should be encouraged, with all opinions accepted. If some readers are shy, it might be courteous to have members write down their thoughts before or at the start of the meet. This allows members to process their thoughts beforehand and become confident contributors.
7. It may seem obvious, but such simple questions as who, what, when, where, and why can really help open up dialogue.
8. Most of all, have fun while fostering a love for reading in a setting where members can enjoy the company of their fellow readers and relish the stories as they unfold!

Fiction for Pre-teens and Children

Pre-teens and children can possess quite an array of reading preferences, abilities, needs, and wants, making them a truly diverse audience! Through reading, these individuals learn about relationships, complex issues, and the challenges and joys they may face throughout childhood and beyond.

Friendship

Books on friendship allow children learn the importance of being a good friend, the nature of friendships, and how to navigate the complexities of friendships. Characters are often portrayed as sharing, showing compassion, cooperating, and even displaying differing perspectives. Friendships are not always harmonious, and books can offer a framework whereby children learn how to resolve differences, understand the changing dynamics of friendships, and accept losing friends—as well as discover that such situations are all part of the normal ups and downs that take place in everyday life.



Listening

Listening is an essential component in the art of enjoying a good book, and children's stories can teach kids to engage, pay attention, listen to others, and follow direction. As listening is one of the basic building blocks of language and communication (particularly in a child's early years), books are an invaluable resource in nurturing this complex process that at any point can be disrupted by such factors as one's stage of development, cognitive ability, state of mind, or health. Books can play a vital role in making the development of this life skill entertaining and fun.



Sharing

Children's books are an effective source for teaching the importance of sharing, as many stories offer insight into situations displaying this important life skill. Characters often portray how sharing preserves friendships, allows for cooperative play, forms the basis of taking turns, and is key in negotiating (and coping with) disappointment. As characters interact, children witness the importance of compromise and fairness—skills transferrable to many true-life situations in the years ahead.



Play

Play features in countless children's books and helps lay the groundwork for the understanding of healthy play, safe play, compromise, and acceptance of differences. Children often use play to experiment with their position in the world, and through observing characters in books, learn to understand the concepts of fair play, discover how to explore through play, and assign meaning to interactions. Play is essential in social and interactive skills and affords children enhanced critical-thinking and problem-solving skills.



Creativity

Books are an invaluable resource when it comes to awakening creativity in children. In the pages of every good read exist words, relationships, landscapes, journeys, and activities—all of which can inspire awe and fire the imagination. Creativity is a vital skill for children, and it is one which can be nurtured. Many books teach that joy is found in creative processes, and although bumps along the way are normal, the primary goal is to learn while having fun!
