

School Day – Morning Routine

- Supervised Yard opens at 8.20am.
- 8 staff supervise outdoors daily from 8.20am 8.30am
- Staff greet children at drop off gate and supervise their entrance to the Junior yard
- Enclosed yard is supervised by staff.
- On rainy days, all classes enter the hall to the right of the main entrance. They are supervised here until their teacher collects them at 8:30am.
- Children are encouraged to line up independently as induction programme details



Afternoon Collections

Children are escorted to the gate at the Junior Yard by their class teacher. Parents wait outside the by the bike shed / front of school. Class teacher releases child to parents/known adult who is permitted to collect the child.

Late collections:

If you are going to be late collecting your child, please contact the office on 01 8272018 / info@powerstownet.com or class teacher and let them know in advance.



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- Permission to collect my child forms are given to all parents/guardians on first day of school.
- Only those people listed on your child's collection form are permitted to collect your child.
- If a person who the class teacher has not met previously is collecting your child, please let the teacher know in advance.
- Any adult unknown to staff collecting children (without teacher's knowledge) will be brought to the office. Parents/Guardians will be contacted to seek approval for releasing children. Adult will also have to sign collection book & give contact details to the school.



AT HOME...

Preparing Your Child For the First Day Back in School

As schools begin to open to more children, parents and children may well be feeling anxious. Here's some ideas of how best to prepare.

Be Calm.

Your child will take their lead from you and be reassured if you are steady and matter of fact.



Be Positive.

Remind them of all the ways they have learnt to keep themselves safe: washing their hands regularly, sneezing and coughing into their elbow, not hugging others and staying in their own space.



Be Supportive

Younger children particularly may struggle with separation anxiety and may become tearful, clingy or act out. Reassure them that you will miss them too and think of them through out the day. It might be helpful to draw a little heart on their wrist and one on yours too. You can call it the hug button and when they find they are missing you they can press the heart and know that you will be doing the same at home. Sometimes having a little object to remind them of you through the day helps but please check this out with your school first.

Be Curious.

These are strange times and their imagination may run away with them. Listen, and try not to dismiss or minimise their fears but validate how they are feeling—"ti's completely fine to feel like that at the moment" or 'l a can really understand why you would feel like that.



Be Thankful.

Help your child think of things they are looking forward to: being with their friends, seeing their teacher, favourite activities but be mindful some of these may not be available for



Be Prepared.

Support your child to be aware of changes that may have happened to their classroom environment since they were there last and rehearse any new routines that school may have shared. Rehearse and practice your 'goodbye' routine and create a 'hello' greeting for the end of the day for them to look forward to.
